Hunters Hill “Mostyn & Kellaway Shields” - Eligibility

The “Andrew Mostyn” Shield is awarded to the best performing, competitive team in the regular season of the junior AND senior clubs combined.

The “Ian Kellaway” Shield is awarded to the best performing, competitive team in the regular season in the junior club.

Teams eligible to participate in the Shields are teams registered with the Hunters Hill Rugby Union Football Club or Hunters Hill Junior Rugby Union Football Club involved in any full season, outdoor winter rugby competition administered by NSW Subbies or SJRU. (ie for juniors only includes from U10 and above)

Teams are eligible to only win one shield each season – ie the team that wins the “Andrew Mostyn” shield becomes ineligible for the “Ian Kellaway” and it shall be awarded to the next qualified team.

1st Grade Kentwell Cup Report 2022

What a successful year for 1st grade for 2022. With a total of 10 wins & one draw within the 14 round season, Ross and I cannot be prouder of the players, as they placed third in the Kentwell Cup Minor Premiership. Not only did the team place third, they also carry the title of the first Hunters Hill team to reach the grand final in the Kentwell Cup since 2001.

To add to this honour, Sam White our halfback was awarded the Kentwell Cup Medal for the Best and Fairest player across the whole 10 teams in the Division One 1st Grade competition – a massive achievement for Sam and the whole First Grade Squad for helping Sam win this major Award!

Having just been promoted to 1st Division in the Pre-Season. The Club was Initially, focused on surviving in 1st Division, to achieve this goal, we had to finish above the bottom 2 spots on the Club Championship Table. The Club surpassed their wildest expectations, by finishing 4th and getting all 4 Grade Teams into the Semi-Finals – a fantastic achievement, by all the players, coaches and support staff – now to win the Club Championship in 2023.

A massive thank you first and foremost to all of the players who made this season so outstanding. Their success is credit to their dedication and hard work. Also, a huge thank you to our coaching staff and medical staff who have been a massive and ongoing support of 1st grade throughout the season.

We started off with a preseason which was hampered by wet weather and as a result we were only able to hold one trial game during the preseason. Despite this, along with many injuries including late injuries 2 five-eighths (Jake Henwood & Sam Ryan) & a halfback (Patrick McCormack), we continued to show the competition we are a force to be reckoned with. Many 1st grade debuts were able to occur this season as well for players from both 2nd grade and the colts program.

In the quarter finals of the Kentwell Cup Major Premiership we beat Petersham 27-22 (4 tries to 3), after trailing 7-22 at half-time the team did not panic and gradually wore down Petersham to secure victory. In the Semi-Final we beat Waverley 29-20 (5 tries to 3) who were ranked second to gain a shot at winning the Final. During our first Kentwell Cup grand final in 21 years we were leading 13-10 at half time. Despite a massive effort and amazing support from our supporters on the day, we unfortunately in the end went down to Colleagues 13-22. This loss finished a run of 7 wins in a row which had put a shiver through the competition as the form team. Sadly, after making very few errors in those 7 undefeated games, we made too many simple errors against the Colleagues relentless rush defence – something we won't do, next year!

Finally, a special thank you to Mr Luke McCormack, as President, for you have built something special and a very strong Club culture. Your leadership and care is very inspirational. To the Board and Rugby Committee, thank you so much.

History has been made and you are all part of it!

Colts Barbour Cup Report 2022

It is always difficult to predict what we are going to get with Colts each year. We don't know what is being discussed in the Year 12 corridors at St Joseph's College the year before.

This year we were swamped with Joeys school leavers. 26 Joeys boys in total with over 80% fresh out of school. Add another 5 or 6 from Holy Cross Ryde and a few others, we ended up with an awkwardly healthy squad of around 36 - a bit too many for one team and not quite enough for two teams.

But I will give this team credit for their grit and determination and fighting hard until the final whistle regardless of the result. We had an enormous roll up to training each and every time and probably averaged 25 Colts at training every Tuesday and Thursday.

Colts coaching staff looked a little uncertain at the beginning of the season but eventually the two Tim's (Forsyth and Vertoudakis) took control of the team and the players really bonded with them. Tim's were momentarily assisted by Murray Hooper and overseen by Matt Crawford (Director of Colts). Plus, the ever-reliable Andrew Skelly was our Assistant Referee each week.

I think retention of players in the Club from this group will be solid which will reflect that it has been an enjoyable year for them despite the results.

A great year for the Cat collective on the hill, highlights were hosting Petersham on B2B day and the Sponsors, Honor Cap and Life Members Day beating Colleagues brought back some great memories. Congratulations to all arms of the club for a successful season.

In memory of the fallen members in 2022.

- **Morrie Willcoxson** (4 Oct 1924 – 7 July 2021) - one of the stalwarts and great administrators of our Club. He was 96. Morrie Willcoxson had a long association with rugby through Eastwood juniors and joined our Club at a pivotal time in the early 70's. Our senior teams had grown and enjoyed considerable success on the field in the few years before, but we needed improved direction and structure in the Club's administration. Morrie was introduced to our club through Michael Moss (Life Member) and was appointed as President in 1972. He continued in that role until 1980.

He was a person of immense integrity, and his strongly held view was that to be a successful Club on the field you needed a sound administration. He was instrumental in establishing clear guidelines for the management committee and stressed the need for codes of behavior. He was a font of knowledge to many of the younger players in the Club whom he encouraged to engage in the various administrative roles and empowered to step up. He knew his limitation with regards the technical side of coaching and did not try to step into the coaching arena and he gave strong support to John Francis who was seniors coach at the same time. Morrie very much enjoyed the social side of rugby, and he would be there at each game, often accompanied by his wonderful wife Gwynne (who predeceased him) and his family.

He was a regular at training sessions and was known to be one of the last to leave “Bert's Cellars” late on a Thursday night/Friday morning. Morrie was awarded Life Membership in 1981. Morrie loved his connection with our Club and continued to follow the Club's fortunes. He would try to get along to various reunions and Back to Boronia Days until his health prevented this. Morrie was a proud Naval WW2 returned serviceman and was happy to regale us with many a tale of a submariner's life! Morrie's term as President coincided with one of our Club's most successful periods – on and off the field – and his contribution to that cannot be understated. He was a true friend and mentor to many in the Club.

- **Bob Mostyn** (18 Sept 1929 - 17 July 2022) - a true icon of Hunters Hill, Bob was an unbelievable friend to our club, supporting us through the decades – generous in every way. Many in the club would have very fond memories of Bob and of his terrific house on Viret St that he foolishly



handed over to the club for dinners and bbqs – a brave man indeed! A great contributor to the broader community and the patriarch of a wonderful family, he will be sadly missed.

- **James McNamara** (23 Jan 1963 - 18 Apr 2022) Many of you would know that James had been very unwell for many years but made the effort to get up to Boronia to support the Hillies whenever he could. James was an enthusiastic follower of the club, twice named Supporter of the Year. The sideline at home games will never look quite the same without him.
- **Brad Hughes** (1956 -16 June 2022) passed away overnight on the 16th of June. He had not been well for some time. Brad played throughout the grades for the Hillies in the highly successful late 70s, early 80s as a small but cunning hooker. He came in a garrison of Riverview greats including Brownny, Pete Miles, Dermot Maxwell and many others including Java. A highly successful SC Barrister he was well regarded in the Sydney law circle. He was a very good mate to many. His wife Lynne and children Laura, Chris and Jack are great supporters of the club. His cheeky laughter will never be forgotten.
- **Leigh Fitton** (3 Mar 1945 - 23 Nov 2021) - Leigh pulled on the black and white hoops 213 times over a career spanning from the early 70s until he finally hung up the boots in 1990. Filling a spot in the front row, Leigh loved his footy. An aspect of his career of which he was immensely proud was that he scored one try for the club, in Round 15, 1979. Every rugby club has its characters. And Leigh was certainly one of those! One thing I am absolutely assured of was that Leigh always had the best interests of our club at heart.
- **Tyrone "Bronco" Cosgrove** (29 Apr 1946 – 29 Sept 2022) Bronco was a member of the premiership winning Whiddon Cup team in 1969. He was a nuggety little hooker who played well above his weight. He hosted many of us at his holiday house at Cottage Point – many a good weekend was spent there.

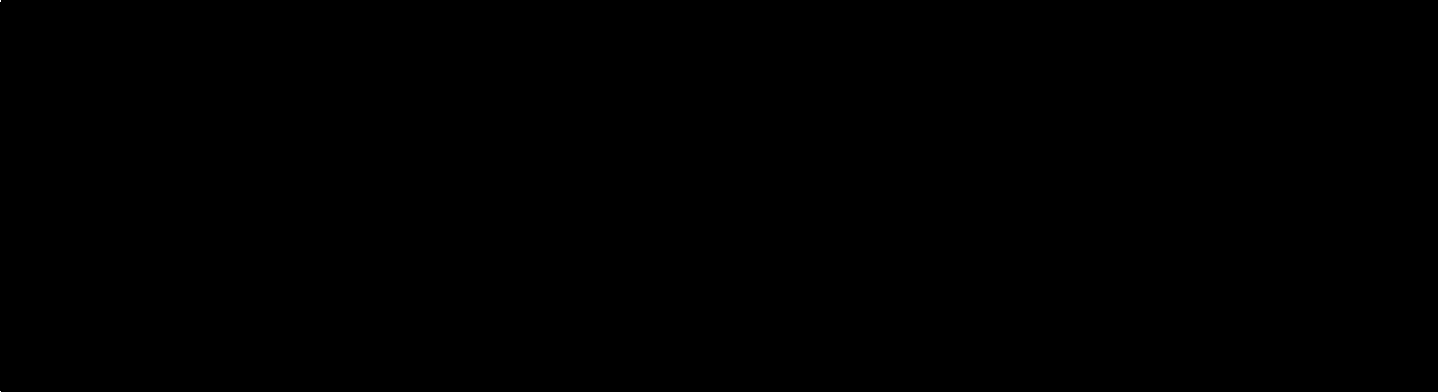
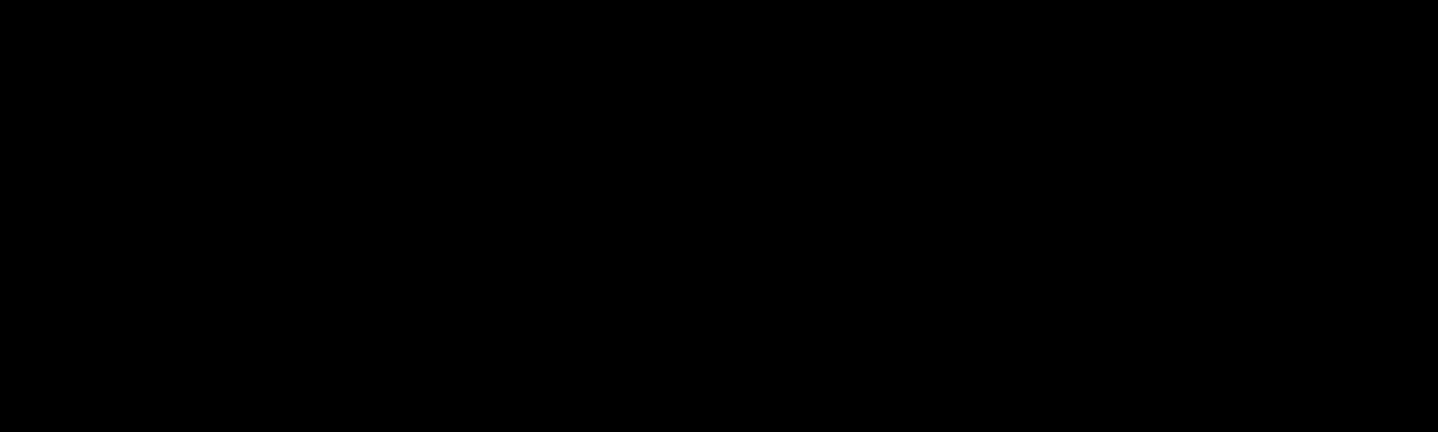
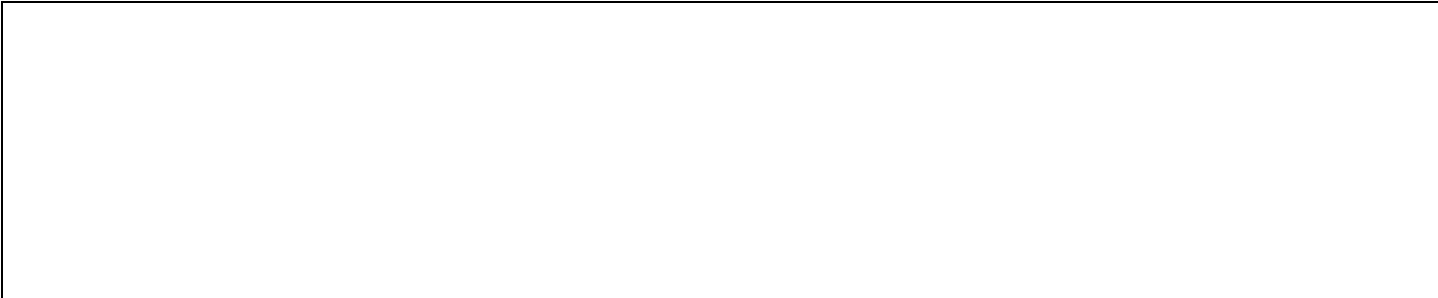
